Bible Reading

Jesus told this story "There was once a man who was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho when robbers attacked him, stripped him, and beat him up, leaving him half dead. It so happened that a priest was going down that road; but when he saw the man, he walked on by on the other side. In the same way a Levite also came there, went over and looked at the man, and then walked on by on the other side. But a Samaritan who was traveling that way came upon the man, and when he saw him, his heart was filled with pity. He went over to him, poured oil and wine on his wounds and bandaged them; then he put the man on his own animal and took him to an inn, where he took care of him. The next day he took out two silver coins and gave them to the innkeeper. 'Take care of him,' he told the innkeeper, 'and when I come back this way, I will pay you whatever else you spend on him.'" And Jesus concluded, "In your opinion, which one of these three acted like a neighbour toward the man attacked by the robbers?" A man answered, "The one who was kind to him." Jesus replied, "You go, then, and do the same."

Creative Prayer 1 ≈ Paper People Chain



This is a good activity for everyone in the household although adults might want to cut out the people for younger children. Take a rectangular piece of paper—A5 works well and you can use an old magazine or whatever you have. Concertina fold it into 6 or 8 depending on the size, equal sections. Draw half a person with the body to the folded edge and with the arm going all the way to the other edge. Cut around the person and then unfold to reveal a chain of people (if you get stuck there are lots of templates and instructions online).

Write names of people you know or people in your community who need your prayers. Maybe you just want to say thank you for someone or maybe you know someone who is ill or having a difficult time at the moment. Once you have written a name on each of the people thank God for hearing your prayers and ask him to be with those you have named.

Put the people prayer chain somewhere you will remember to keep praying for these people. You can add others to it too.

Creative Prayer 2 ≈ Our Global Community



It's good to remember that we are all part of a larger global community with neighbours all over the world.

Find some time and space to say the daily prayer from our friends at CAFOD

You might also like to play this game which is a traditional game our friends in Lahore, children and adults, might play. It is called *Geetay* and you may have played something similar. As many people as you like can play and it's a good one for playing outside. You need 5 small objects about 1.5cm—2cm across like stones for example stones.

Throw one stone in the air and pick other stones from the ground before catching the one in the air. How many can you do? If you find it easy, increase the number of objects to pick up.



As you play and have fun you could pray for our friends in Lahore. You could even see if you can say the prayer above whilst playing!

Activity 1 ≈ Community Messages

Encourage your neighbours by creating some messages to go in your window or hang up outside if it isn't raining! First think of words or phrases that spread positivity i.e. You're Amazing, Stay strong, Hang in there, Have Faith, God is with us, God loves You.

Write the words on pieces of paper, decorate them and then display them in your window for your neighbours and community to see.



Activity 2 ≈ Children in Need - Research

This week is BBC Children in Need week. What do you know about the BBC Children in Need Charity? Do you know if they help with any projects in your area? Do some research to find out about what Children In Need do. See if you can find any information about projects they may fund or support in your area (what do they do and why they are needed?).
