- **Do not worry or feel guilty!**
- Find time when available to you, change or adapt timetable to fit in with you!
- See what support is available online e.g. Google or YouTube.
- Contact Class Teacher via DOJO but please be patient awaiting a response as they are teaching.
- Prioritise the core subjects – Reading, Writing and Maths.
- Plan in plenty of breaks for yourself and your child.
- Create a day personalised to your work commitments and you.



Please remember → When children are self-isolating, it is **only** temporary/for a short period. Your child will be back into school as soon as they have completed their allocated number of days or it is safe for them to return. Children may struggle to learn in the same way they would at school, **do the best you can!**
