

Long Term Plan for School Worship – Autumn, Spring and Summer Terms 2022 – 2023

Our vision for education is deeply Christian, with Jesus' promise of 'life in all its fullness' at its heart. St James and Emmanuel Academy Trust schools create an enthusiasm for learning that will shape children's lives and future chances, enabling them to grow into responsible and productive adults.

Our desire 'to grow' is also built upon our faith foundations. To 'grow' a child is a privileged calling and to nurture that girl or boy as they develop in their unique skills and aptitudes is a charge that nobody or no institution should enter into lightly.

Our Vision is encapsulated in the strapline: **Belonging, Believing and Becoming**. These three words sum up our mission statements and our faith foundation as a Church of England school.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, collective worship is carried out through virtual sessions and collectively in the hall where possible. The Christian values, British values, Big Question, RRS articles and SMSC themes are explained and delivered by members of the leadership team, school groups (Ethos Group, School Council, Eco Group and Reading Ambassadors) and subject leaders. There is one session a week where collective worship is delivered by the class teacher. Collective worship is reflected upon in the class reflection book and in the newsletter.

At St Wilfrid's CE Primary school, we seek to promote British values in our policies and practice. Our activities and the way we manage learning and behaviour, clearly reflect British values. We promote these values across the curriculum and explicitly explain them to our pupils during collective worship.

We encourage pupils to understand and promote our school Christian values. Our Christian Values are closely linked with our learning powers (Growth Mindset and Super learners) and help the children to develop as they continue through school and their faith journey. Anglican Greetings

At St Wilfrid's CE Primary school, we use a range of Anglican greetings and prayers that support worship and bring depth to our pupils' experiences. The Big Question

We want our children to be reflective about their own beliefs, religious or otherwise and to develop their own perspective on life.
We believe they should have an interest in and respect for people's different faiths, feelings and values.

We have an exciting way delivering SMSC using a philosophical enquiry approach. We use Picture News to engage and educate children about current issues locally, nationally and internationally. The children are introduced to a 'Big Question', which is delivered to pupils in KS1 and KS2 by the RE and Worship Time lead, and then in classes.
