Types and Warning Signs of Abuse

Cyber Bullying

Emotional

Constant belittling, shaming, and humiliating a child.

Telling a child he or she is "no good," "worthless," "bad," or "a mistake."

Sexual

Displays knowledge or interest in sexual acts inappropriate to his or her age.

Excessively withdrawn, fearful.

Is frequently late or missing from school.

Makes strong efforts to avoid a specific person, without an obvious reason.

ATTENDANCE

- ◆ When a child is absent or missing from school, they could be at risk of significant harm.
- ◆ Regular attendance at school makes a critical contribution to safeguarding.
- ◆ Monitoring children's attendance enables us to identify children and families who need early intervention support.
